Dan Andriacco, BSI, ASH, is a former journalist and reviewer of mystery books who has led The Tankerville Club since 2018 (and has been a member since 1981). In addition to his writing & speaking on Sherlock Holmes, he has produced at least one new mystery novel a year since 2011. Dan edits *The Essential Sherlock Holmes* series for Belanger Books and is married to the lovely and talented Ann Andriacco.

Joshua Harvey is a faculty member, music director/conductor, accompanist, and voice teacher at the Dobbins Conservatory of Theatre and Dance at Southeast Missouri State University, where he teaches topics such as music theory, musical theatre score study, and musical theatre history. His major Sherlockian interest is the music of adaptations, with a specialization in the music of the Granada series written by Patrick Gowers.

Heather Holloway, BSI, ASH, became a Sherlockian in ninth grade and never looked back. She lives south of Atlanta, GA with her very beautiful but old cat, Luna. She is a co-founder and director of 221B Con, serves on the Grants Committee of the Beacon Society, co-edits ASH's *The Serpentine Muse*, and is active in her local scion.

Rich Krisciunas, has practiced criminal law for 47 years as a prosecutor and defense attorney. He is a member of the Ribston-Pippins, the Amateur Mendicant Society of Detroit, and several other scions virtually, including the Legion of Zoom.

Bonnie MacBird, BSI, ASH, is best known by Sherlockians as the author of the Sherlock Holmes Adventure Series for HarperCollins. The series currently comprises *Art in the Blood*, *Unquiet Spirits*, *The Devil's Due*, and *The Three Locks*, with a fifth book to be released in October. An avid amateur musician, she earned a Bachelor's Degree in Music from Stanford University and now studies violin with Richard Crabtree in London. She currently "saws away on" a violin that was played by Benedict Cumberbatch in the BBC's *Sherlock*.

Steve Mason, BSI, ASH, is the long-time Third Mate (President) of "The Crew of the Barque Lone Star" in Dallas/Fort Worth. He is also the Chair of the Communications Committee for The Beacon Society. With Joe Fay and Rusty Mason, he produces the "Baker Street Elementary" comic strip. Since COVID, he's been one of the Sherlockian community's Zoom wizards, a role he is filling today at Scintillation XV.

Ira Matetsky, BSI, ASH, is a New York-based Sherlockian and lawyer. He has contributed to *The Baker Street Journal* and several BSI Press books, and has spoken at several Sherlockian conferences and scion events.

Crystal Noll, BSI, ASH, is a co-founder and director of 221B Con and co-editor of *The Serpentine Muse*. She chairs the Fundraising Committee of The Beacon Society. When not Sherlocking, she's either traveling, dabbling in theatre, or working for the City of Warner Robins Parks and Recreation Department.

Rob Nunn, BSI, ASH, is Gasogene of The Parallel Case of St. Louis and member of many other Sherlockian groups. He is the co-editor of *The Finest Assorted Collection*, author of *The Common-Place Book* and *The Criminal Mastermind of Baker Street*, and recipient of the Beacon Award for the annual Sherlock Holmes unit he teaches to his 5th grade students. He lives in Edwardsville, IL with his wife & daughter, and his interviews with other Sherlockians can be found on his blog, *Interesting Though Elementary*.

Madeline Quiñones is a member of the John H. Watson Society and a contributor to their podcast, "The Watsonian Weekly." She also runs her own video podcast, "Dynamics of a Podcast," focused on Professor Moriarty. Sometimes she blogs about Sherlock Holmes, sometimes she writes stories (one of which was published in Belanger Books' *The Nefarious Villains of Sherlock Holmes*, Volume II), sometimes she updates an irregular webcomic called "The Adventures of Professor Moriarty," and at all times, she acknowledges that she very much has a brand.

Dana Richards, BSI, is a professor of Computer Science at George Mason University. His first Sherlockian publication was as a graduate student in 1979. Since then he has published in *The Baker Street Journal*, *Canadian Holmes*, *The Sherlock Holmes Journal*, *Baker Street Miscellanea* and numerous other places. He is the editor of the recent BSI Press volume, *My Scientific Methods: Sherlock Holmes and Science*.

Karen Wilson, BSI, ASH, is a Baltimore-area teacher & church musician. She is a past Gasogene of Watson's Tin Box of Ellicott City, MD, a member of many other mid-Atlantic-area scions, and the director of Scintillation XV.
